

## COMMON DELAYS THAT KEEP YOU FROM GETTING ELECTRICITY

ONCE A STAKING ENGINEER HAS MET WITH YOU, EXPLAINED WHAT DOCUMENTS YOU WILL NEED, AND STAKED THE JOB, THE JOB IS THEN PROCESSED THROUGH SVEC'S ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT.

THE JOB WILL BE HELD IN THE ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT IF ANY OF THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTS ARE NEEDED:

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- A COPY OF YOUR BUILDING PERMIT WHICH IS ISSUED BY THE COUNTY BUILDING DEPARTMENT. **\*REQUIRED FOR ALL NEW SERVICE\***
- A COPY OF THE "911" ADDRESS NOTIFICATION FOR ANY RESIDENTIAL SERVICE
- RIGHT-OF-WAY EASEMENT(S) "SEE PAGE 2 LINE ITEM 5 FOR EASEMENT REQUIREMENTS"
- IF JOB COST EXCEEDS SVEC LINE EXTENTION ALLOWANCE, THE MEMBER WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE DIFFERENCE. THIS DIFFERENCE MUST BE PAID IN FULL BEFORE JOB CAN BE RELEASED FROM ENGINEERING (SEE PAGE 2 LINE ITEM 6 FOR MORE DETAILS)

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ONCE THE ENGINEERING DEPARTMENT HAS RELEASED THE JOB TO THE OPERATIONS DEPARTMENT, IT WILL BE HELD FOR THE FOLLOWING:

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- FINAL INSPECTION FROM THE COUNTY BUILDING INSPECTOR (FOR ANY RESIDENTIAL PERMIT THIS ISN'T GIVEN UNTIL WELL, SEPTIC, ELECTRIC, ETC. ARE ALL SIGNED OFF ON)
- IF YOU REQUESTED UNDERGROUND SERVICE. THE TRENCH WILL NEED TO BE INSPECTED BY SVEC, THIS INSPECTION WILL BE DONE AFTER THE FINAL INSPECTION FROM THE COUNTY INSPECTION (SEE PAGE 2 LINE ITEM 10 FOR MORE DETAILS)
- IF YOU HAVE RIGHT OF WAY TO CUT (TREES INSIDE 30 FT OF WHERE THE PRIMARY POWER LINE WILL BE) THE RIGHT OF WAY WILL HAVE TO BE INSPECTED BY SVEC, THIS INSPECTION WILL BE DONE AFTER THE FINAL INSPECTION FROM THE COUNTY INSPECTOR (SEE PAGE 3 FOR SVEC RIGHT OF WAY REQUIREMENTS)
